

FLASHING AMBER LAMP PERMIT ELIGIBILITY PRE-SCREENING

Intent of Amber Flashing Lamp

The overall intent of supplementary or additional flashing amber lamp devices on a vehicle, outside of existing regulatory allowances, is to identify a stationary vehicle that may be a hazard to other road users or pedestrians. This intent is limited to vehicles that **must** be positioned or parked on **highways** for legitimate purposes with no viable option of locating the vehicle off-highway.

There is NO INTENT EXPRESSED or IMPLIED that activation of a flashing amber lamp device provides a measure of safety for workers or persons in proximity to the stationary vehicle.

Any Vehicles equipped with flashing amber lights must meet the criteria of an “**official vehicle**” as defined in the [BC Motor Vehicle Act Regulations Division 47.01](#).
